



Objectives of the Seminar on the Role of Women in Sports:

Creating the history by the boxing champion Mary Kom who was offered the prestigious position of the Member of the Parliament in the Rajya Sabha, Manipur is known to the rest of the world as the **Powerhouse of Sports**.

However, the participation of Muslim women in sports is very less. Muslim women are equally smart or even smarter than others in sports yet they cannot expose their potentials because of societal factors and religious constraints. However, during the last five years some girls of the community have come up in various fields of sports even in the martial arts. The Muslim women have been actively participating in most of the economic activities. This is a unique culture which is not seen in the rest of the world. The negligible participation of Muslim women in sports is not because of lack of talents but a social issue which needs timely intervention. It is the right time to discuss the issue as an important agenda. This seminar on the theme: **'Role of Women in Sports'** organised by Lilong Haoreibi College, Thoubal District, Manipur in association with the National Commission for Women (NCW), New Delhi shall provide a platform to transact the ideas and share knowledge towards dealing with the issue before it is too late. The seminar is expected to throw light on this issue in particular and on various other sub-themes in general within the broad theme "Role of Women in Sports".

The Genesis

Manipuri Muslims, also known as Meitei-Pangal are believed to be the descendants of those Muslims who was brought to Manipur in 1606 A.D. during the reign of King Khagemba. It is said that Muslims came to assist Prince Sanongba in his revolt against his elder brother King Khagemba over the issue of a broken boat which is known in history as 'Sanongba Higai'. After the revolt, the Muslims were allowed to settle in Manipur by offering Meitei girls as wives. They were helpful to the king by bringing an industrial revolution through their inherent skills in various fields such as agriculture, carpentry, handloom and handicrafts, fishing, paper making, tailoring, house building, bamboo crafts etc.

In the 'historical background' of the vision document 'Manipur 2047' released recently, it is clearly mentioned that the period of King Khagemba when Muslims settled in Manipur was known as the Golden Era in Manipur as there was a great Industrial Revolution through the discovery of a flying shuttle called Pangadem. The King offered clans to the Muslims based on their skills and type of workforce. Those who are experts in carpentry were given the clan Phundreimayum, those who were skilful in playing royal trumpets as Singamayum, those who were talented in paper making as Chesam, pottery making as Phusam, experts in royal palanquin as Dolaipabam and so on. Now, the rich traditional art, culture and sports of the Meitei Pangals are dying, their skills are neither preserved nor transmitted to the younger generations.

National Commission for Women:

The National Commission for Women was set up as statutory body in January 1992 under the National Commission for Women Act, 1990 to:

- review the Constitutional and Legal safeguards for women;
- recommend remedial legislative measures;
- facilitate redressal of grievances and
- advise the Government on all policy matters affecting women.

In keeping with its mandate, the Commission initiated various steps to improve the status of women and worked for their economic empowerment during the year under report. The Commission completed its visits to all the States/UTs except Lakshadweep and prepared Gender Profiles to assess the status of women and their empowerment. It received a large number of

complaints and acted suo-moto in several cases to provide speedy justice. NCW took up the issue of child marriage, sponsored legal awareness programmes, Parivarik MahilaLok Adalats and reviewed laws such as Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961, PNDT Act 1994, Indian Penal Code 1860 and the National Commission for Women Act, 1990 to make them more stringent and effective. It organized workshops/consultations, constituted expert committees on economic empowerment of women, conducted workshops/seminars for gender awareness and took up publicity campaign against female foeticide, violence against women etc. in order to generate awareness in the society against these social evils (<http://ncw.nic.in>).

About the College

Established in 1976, Lilong Haoreibi Government College is the only higher educational institute located at the socially, economically and educationally backward Minority Muslims concentrated area in Thoubal District of Manipur. The College has been assessed and accredited in January 2022 with B Grade (2.39 CGPA) by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). Recognized under section 2 (f) and 12 (B) of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956, the co-educational institute offers 17 undergraduate programmes in B.A. and B. Sc. with 56 regular teaching faculties. The college has also been approved for B Voc. degree programmes in 5 specialized disciplines namely Agriculture, IT/ITes, Tourism & Hospitality, Yoga & Naturopathy, and Physical Education & Sports. However, only the discipline of Agriculture has been started from the academic session 2020-21.

Lilong Haoreibi College stands alongside the Indo Myanmar International Highway near Usoipokpi hillock, spreading over 16.78 acres of a beautiful landscape at a distance of 15 kilometres from Imphal, the capital city of Manipur.

The College is not yet officially declared as the Minority College but enrolls more than 95% of the students belonging to Minorities. At present, 2, 248 students are pursuing BA/BSc degree in Botany, Chemistry, English, Economics, Education, Environmental Science, Geography, History, Home Science, Mathematics, Manipuri, Political Science, Physics, Philosophy, Zoology and B Voc. Agriculture, developed 6 smart classrooms from these academic sessions where high end interactive digital boards are used in the teaching learning process. BSNL leased line internet broadband connectivity with 12MBPS speed has been introduced from this academic session with the campus Wi-Fi facilities. Library automation with KOHA software and e-resources through INFLIBNET has been provided where thousands of text and reference books, e-journals etc. can be accessed.

Lilong Haoreibi College in association with the Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development Sriperumbudur, has organized successfully a 3-Day Faculty Development Programme on the Role of Teachers in Integrating Skill Development in the Higher Education through NEP 2020 which was participated by more than 150 faculties serving in various colleges and universities. The College always emphasizes the participation of Muslim girl students in games and sports. Recently, the College has also hosted the Manipur University Intercollege Volley Ball Tournament (3rd – 5th Nov, 2022) which is also a part of motivation of youths, particularly the Muslim girls, in the field of sports.
